

## CHAPTER V

### CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION

#### 5.1 CONCLUSION

In this study 515 respondents were investigated on “An assessment of blended learning readiness among the University Sains Islam Malaysia (USIM)”. And the purpose of the study is to understand the perceptions of the students about adoption of blended learning, computer mediated instructions and computer security knowledge awareness in the blended learning environment. An effective and efficient blended learning model will provide more flexibility for students to learn, satisfied and enhance the learning experience of their students. The majority of the respondents were satisfied with the adoption of blended learning, many of them give a satisfactory response towards the computer security issues and some of the respondents needed to be given an orientation on computer mediated instruction. However, it is important for students to have confidence in the lecturers of the university. Sometimes student sees lecturer as their role model and experienced lecturer will be able to implement different teaching methods to make learning more effective for the students. Without excellence, executive support from the realm of the university, no university will be able to utilize the blended learning approach and great executive support will provide greater satisfaction for the students which directly enhance the institution’s academic excellence.

## 5.2 RECOMMENDATIONS

An institution that adopted a blended learning must make sure that the structure which include both content and interface design of the courses are suitable and have an effective interaction with the learners. Effective interaction can be sustained by regular activities and project that can foster expectancy and satisfaction of the learners. Second, regular feedbacks and recognitions to the learners are essential in order for learner to fulfill their needs and let them feel involved. Third, the institution needs to create awareness for the students that do not have blended learning knowledge.
